HOW TO USE THIS NAVIGATOR

Choose a topic, find the guide by title and bring your questions to your clinician. Move between pathways as your needs change.

URGENT SYMPTOMS: Do not wait to read a guide. Sudden chest pain, severe breathlessness, collapse or severe rapidly worsening pain needs emergency assessment.

Evidence & references

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Navigation, not a clinical protocol

The six pathways organize available GEM titles. Their order is flexible and does not prescribe treatment. Website links were not supplied or verified, so the navigator now instructs readers to find guides by title.

Urgent symptoms

Readers are told to seek appropriate emergency assessment instead of waiting to read or complete educational materials.
